HIV Law Project believes that all people deserve the same rights, including the right to live with dignity and respect, the right to be treated as equal members of society, and the right to have their basic human needs fulfilled. These fundamental rights are elusive for many people living with HIV/AIDS. Through innovative legal services and advocacy programs, HIV Law Project fights for the rights of the most underserved people living with HIV/AIDS.

Program Highlights

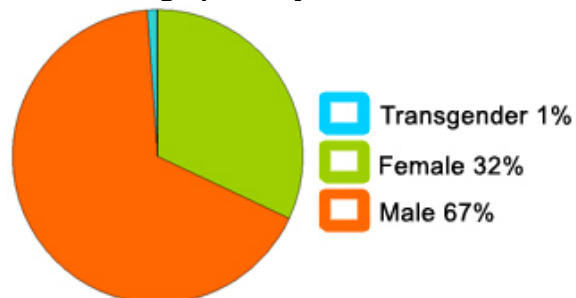
Despite a significant reduction in Federal Ryan White funding and a period of staffing shortages, HIV Law Project maintained the high-quality and high-impact services and programs for which it is known. Some highlights for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2008 were:

- **Handled 901 cases (553 clients)**
 - 527 new cases open during
 - 354 cases resolved during benefiting 469 people
 - 31 people avoided homelessness
 - 96 preserved/increased benefits
 - 26 obtained immigration benefits (asylum, LPR, citizenship, PRUCOL)
 - 24 preserved family benefits (custody, pp, prevented TPR)
- **Delivered 9,385 hrs. of legal services**
- **Provided 170 instances of legal technical assistance** to other service providers, totaling 118 legal hours (approx. value \$16,700)
- **Graduated 15 women** from the LawTap

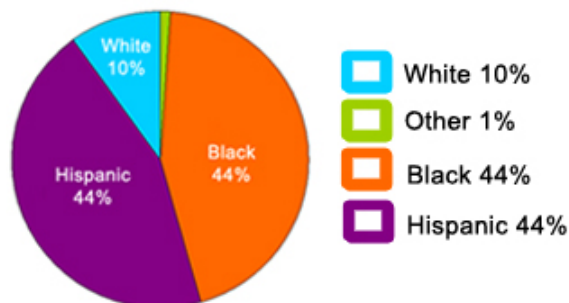

Client Demographics by Race

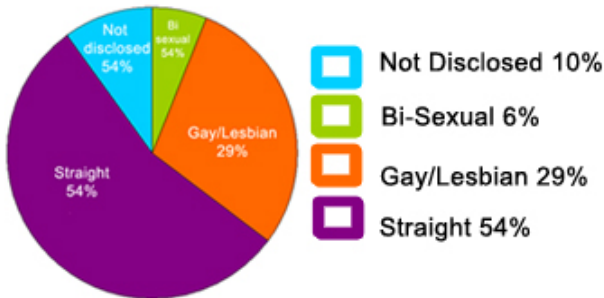

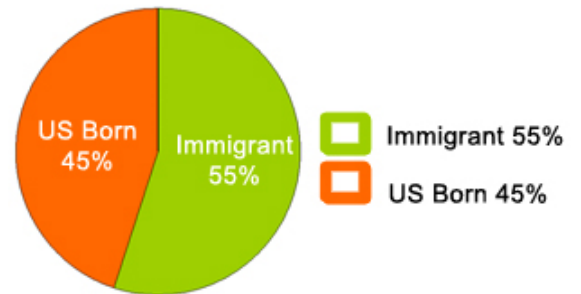

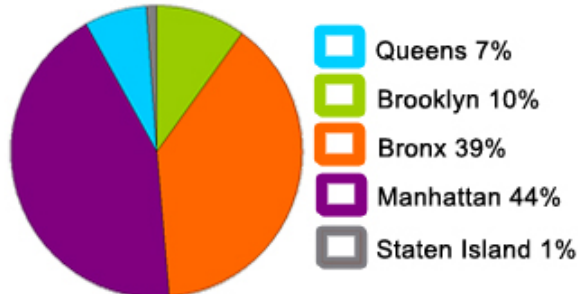
Client Demographics by Sexual Orientation
